As per previous correspondence with Helen Heydenrych we would like to submit an application for planning consent for the installation of a marine park information structure on Shire reserve 17937 Nornalup.

Please note when looking at the drawings it is the 4 panel structure that will be used not the 3 panel structure drawn on the same page.

We have provided a copy of the first <u>draft</u> of the signs for your information. We are aware that there are some changes to be made to both content and design before finalisation.

Once the sign is installed some minor site works such as providing a flat gravelled pad will be required to provide an aesthetically pleasing and safe environment for visitors. It is likely that there will need to be a small amount of vegetation removed to ensure the sign can be well placed and away from the road surface. DEC will carry out all associated works as well as any future maintenance and upgrading in a timely manner.







# Walpole and Nornalup Inlets Marine Park





Please go slow near shore lines to prevent shoreline erosion and disturbance to waterbirds and other marine park users.

Stay on tracks when accessing the marine park to protect fragile estuarine vegetation.

The entire marine park is zoned for recreation. Therefore, recreational fishing is permitted in



Fires are not permitted in areas surrounding the marine park unless a fire ring is provided. Campfires are prohibited when the fire danger is rated at very high or above



Camping is not permitted on the shores of the marine park.



Pets are not permitted in the surrounding Walpole-Nornalup National Park or in the waters of the marine park, however, visitors may take their pets on their vessels. If you will be out for an extended time, please consider leaving your pets at home for their health and wellbeing.

- Feeding our native animals and birds can be harmful.

#### in WA, fishing licences are required for the following:

- Recreational Fishing from Boat (required for any general fishing activity conducted with the use of a powered boat)
- Rock Lobster
- Abalone
- Marron
- South-West Freshwater Angling; and
- Net fishing\* (set, haul and throw nets)
   \*Not permitted in the Walpole & Nornalup inlets.

You may purchase or renew your licences online at www.fish.wa.gov.au or at any Australia Post outlet and Department of Fisheries office.

All revenue from recreational fishing licences goes directly to the research and management of WA's recreational fisheries.

Fishing in the Walpole & Nornalup Inlets Marine Park Recreational fishing is permitted in the Walpole and Nornalup inlets.

For the most up-to-date recreational fishing rules for this area, check the Department of Fisheries website or contact your nearest Department of Fisheries office before going fishing.



Spearfishing, including the use of hand spears (gidgees) and spear guns, is not permitted anywhere within the Walpole and Nornalup inlets.




The use of set, haul and throw nets is not permitted anywhere in the Walpole and Nornalup inlets.





# Boating Safety


Be aware that the channel to the entrance of the Nornalup Inlet changes position regularly and water can be extremely shallow in places.

Vessels are limited to eight knots in the Walpole Inlet, the channel between the inlets and the Frankland, Deep and Walpole rivers. As well as:



- 🥭 🗷 In or through a mooring area
- Within 15 metres of a vessel underway; and
  - <sup>™</sup> ✓ Within 45 metres of:
- (i) a moored vessel;
- a person in the water;
- (iii) a jetty or wharf; or
- (iv) a river bank or low water mark.

Please also be aware that there is a boating exclusion zone adjacent to Coalmine Beach.



### Parsonal Witter Craft - Jarakis

Every person on board a Personal Water Craft (PWC) must wear a personal flotation device (PFD) at all times. If you are exiting the marine park into unprotected waters please make yourself aware of PFD and other safety equipment requirements.

Free style driving and wake jumping is prohibited:

- within any speed restricted area;
  - 🌦 🚁 Within 30 metres of another PWC; and
- Within 50 metres of another vessel or person in the water.

Freestyle driving is driving a PWC in such a way that the driver of another vessel would be unable to predict your course or speed in order to avoid a collision with you.

Water Skiing is not permitted in the Walpole and Nornalup Inlets Marine Park. Water skiing is defined as being towed behind a motor boat on skis or any other apparatus including knee boards, wake boards and sea biscuits at more than 8 knots. (Garanton) Stores (Max (CED)



The person in charge of a recreational vessel with a motor greater than 4.5 kilowatts (6HP) must hold a Recreational Skippers Ticket.


Re: Installation of sign structure Nornalup Jetty Site

As you are aware Nornalup is a place of strong Cultural Heritage and Tradition. It is also an Aboriginal Site of significance that until recently contained Archaeological material. Unfortunately this area has been disturbed quite extensively by the removal and poisoning of the river front wetlands, the re-claiming of land and the illegal burning of the vegetation.

However I am confident that Department of Environment (DEC), Denmark Shire and Department of Indigenous Affairs will continue to pursue the offenders of this environmental vandalism.

I am also aware that the area cannot be left in the condition that it's presently in, and that further work on the car park area needs to be completed before it also becomes a threat to the river system.

I am therefore offering this letter of support for the installation of a sign at the Nornalup Jetty area. Although the sign and its footings will be well within the 30m waters edge at approximately 10m, I am confident that it will not impinge upon the actual archeological site. Through consultation with DEC I have been made fully aware of the size of the area that is needed to be disturbed in order for the sign to be erected and to ensure no archaeological materials are disturbed I would like to be present during any ground disturbing work while this work goes ahead.



My consultation and on-site fee will be charged at the normal rate of \$600.00. This will include, 2 people, a short 1 or 2 page report of the days activities, previous consultations, travel, meals and includes GST.
