A local government may from time to time appoint such persons as it thinks necessary to be its bush fire control officers under and for the purposes of this Act, and of those officers shall subject to section 38A(2) appoint 2 as the Chief Bush Fire Control Officer and the Deputy Chief Bush Fire Control Officer who shall be first and second in seniority of those officers, and subject thereto may determine the respective seniority of the other bush fire control officers appointed by it."

Firstly thank you for the support you have given myself, Nigel and Shane over the last 12 months, it is appreciated.

Annual Skills Refresher 2022.

Whilst the Annual Skills Refresher was put out to FCO's, Captains and 1st Lieutenants only last year this year, (2022/20223), all active members are now required to complete the Annual Skills Refresher in order to stay current with their training prior to the next Fire Season.

This Refresher can be completed in stages in normal Brigade training. Please advise when your Brigade will be doing the training and either myself or a Deputy will also attend in order to sign off the completion record.

It is recommended to begin the Skills Refresher now and complete it in stages.

The Annual Skills Refresher completion sheets are now available in folders for your Brigades records.

We can assist you in training so give a shout out if required.

Nigel and Shane have put together a package which contains all of the relevant DFES training for the subjects we are looking at, these have been distributed to Brigades. This is a comprehensive standardised training resource for those subjects so that all Brigades are at the same DFES recognised standard.

No Pre Season training will be held.

Myself and the Deputies are putting a 3+ year plan in place including a Burns plan. Please let me know if there are any areas within your patch that you would like to see have a Hazard Reduction Burn completed.

New Fire Danger Rating System.

This new system is being introduced on September 1st 2022.

The new Fire Danger Rating framework will now be a 4 rating system.

	Fire Behaviour Index Range	Community Messaging
Moderate	12-23	Plan and be prepared to act
High	24-49	Be ready to act
Extreme	50-99	Fires will be extremely dangerous Take action now
Catastrophic	100+	Fires will be deadly. It is not safe to be in a Bushfire Risk
area		

This information needs to be prioritised in order to go out with the Firebreak and Fuel Management Notice in a timely manner.

Regarding the point at when are all Permits cancelled. It was very convenient that we were able to cancel all Permits when we reached a Very High FDR.

This cut off point has being suggested in the attachment below.

Once again I feel that a strong constant publication is required to educate the public on what the new signage and regulations are and what they mean.

PREPAREDNESS

- UCL funding application to DFES has been approved in full for 2022/23 for crown land mitigation works.
- Please forward any outstanding vehicle faults

PPE

- Overspend application to DFES was approved and initial 50% order has been placed.
- Respirators an initial quantity of 150 half face respirators has been approved and 50% order has been placed. Product information and care instructions will be sent out via email.
- Laundering of PPE Shadforth and Ocean Beach recently assisted at a house fire where asbestos was prevalent. Tunics were removed and bagged at the scene and dry cleaned professionally. Please be mindful of potential contaminants when assisting at structure fires.
- New PPE form includes unisex sizing with fitting guides on reverse. Copies provided.
 Please also note 3M respirator sizing Medium is most common/average size.

TRAINING

- Intro courses 13/14th August. 13 applicants so far. Students will receive confirmation via email. *Note courses now fully booked
- Please encourage all new members to complete AIIMS awareness which is useful intro to eAcademy on Volunteer Hub.
- Training (1 day) for new FCOs is available in Woodanilling 10th August and Cranbrook 17th September.
- For existing FCOs, a region-wide refresher course is being considered for the Great Southern, to be conducted via MS Teams. Would include discussion around new Fire Danger Rating System. Is there an appetite for Denmark to be involved?
- Machine Supervision for bushfire 20th August at Denmark VFRS (Crew Leader is prerequisite)
