Project Description:

Upgrading the permanent target frames on the 25 meter and 50meter range

Extending the permanent target frames on the 50 meter range from 15 to 20

10 New permanent target frames on the 100 meter range

Target benches and target mounds on the 100m range.

A unisex / wheel chair accessible toilet on the 100m range.

How did you establish a need for your project?

The current permanent target frames on the 25 meter and 50 meter range are basic in design and require the use of clips or rubber straps to hold the cardboard targets in place. This is an ineffectual method because the clips and straps do not hold up and often members have their target fall off the frame during a match. There is concern for safety when targets fall because it can be very distracting to the shooters on the firing line. Furthermore it disrupts the match because shooting must cease so the targets can be replaced.

In addition to upgrading the frames design we would install 5 more targets on our 50 meter range to extend them from 15 to 20 frames. This would help us run more efficient matches because we could accommodate more people on the firing line.

On our 100 meter range we do not have any target frames which limits its use. Installing 10 new frames would allow us to expand our rifle competitions.

Also on the 100 meter range we required target benches and mounds. These are an essential upgrade to the range as they would prevent ricochet from leaving the range ensuring a high level of safety is maintained during matches.

Currently there is no access to a toilet on the 100m range which again limits its use. To develop further it's essential that our club provides basic facilities that can meet the needs of our members and members of the public. We would then have the facilities required to host more public events and competitions between clubs

How will your project increase physical activity? The addition of new target frames and a unisex / wheelchair accessible toilet opens up huge potential for the pistol club to expand and grow. We can expand our use of the 100 meter range to include more rifle competitions which could add a potential increase to our membership because we will have another shooting discipline to offer. In particular we would like to offer bench rest rifle. In this type of competition all participants are sitting down and resting their rifle on a bench. This is an ideal competition for new shooter training and for people with physical limitations to participate in. The club could now promote this because we would have the facilities required to accommodate people who previously may have not been able to compete.

It would also mean we have the facilities to help develop and train new shooters. The Denmark Pistol Club has been approached by Denmark College of Agriculture to assist teaching firearm safety and awareness to its students. Particularly the safe use and handling of rifles for they are common tools used in agriculture. Currently we are limited with the service we could offer to the College but with the proposed facilities and upgrades the club could provide regular training for the safe handling and responsible use of rifles for Agricultural students. The club would also be able to host more inter club matches. We currently host an annual pistol shoot with two Perth Clubs but we would love to see that expand to rifles competitions and other local clubs. In summary the proposed upgrades and additions to our club will really improve its function. They unlock the potential for us to attract many new members with new rifle matches and help train Agricultural students. It will increase the number of events we can host and we would be able to promote competitions to people who may have been unable to participate in previously because of their physical limitations. 

Project Description:

CONSTRUCT DOUBLE SIDED TENNIS PRACTICE WALL WHICH ALLOWS SEVERAL PLAYERS ACCESS AT THE SAME TIME.

PRACTICE WALL WILL BE LOCATED ADJACENT TO THE EXISTING TENNIS COURTS, OUTSIDE THE FENCED AREA SO IT IS ACCESSIBLE AT ALL TIMES.

How did you establish a need for your project?

THE DENMARK COUNTRY CLUB – TENNIS SECTION HAS EXPERIENCED AN INCREASING MEMBERSHIP OVER THE PAST FIVE YEARS, INCLUDING AN INCREASE IN JUNIOR MEMBERS FROM 40 IN 2012 TO 75 IN 2015.

ESTABLISHING THE TENNIS HOTSHOT PROGRAM HAS DRAMATICALLY INCREASED JUNIOR PARTICIPATION. CLOSE LIAISON WITH LOCAL SCHOOLS SHOULD ENSURE CONTINUED EXPANSION AS WELL AS HAVING SCHOOLS USE THESE FACILITIES FOR SCHOOL SPORTS PROGRAMS.

A CORPORATE COMPETITION IN SUMMER HAS ENGAGED WORKERS AFTER HOURS, A NUMBER HAVE SINCE JOINED THE CLUB. THIS HAS PROVED POPULAR AND HAS BECOME A FIXTURE IN THE TENNIS CALENDAR.

THE EXISTING COURT SPACE CONSISTS OF 8 COURTS IN A FENCED AREA. DURING A NORMAL CLUB EVENT, ALL EIGHT COURTS ARE FULLY SUBSCRIBED AND THERE IS NO ACCESS TO WARM UP SPACE OR AREAS FOR COACHING AND TRAINING.

THE CLUB OFFERS COACHING CLINICS FOR JUNIOR MEMBERS. COACHING CLINICS OFTEN UTILISE ALL OF THE COURT SPACE, WITH NO ADDITIONAL SPACE FOR JUNIORS TO PRACTICE. OFTEN JUNIORS WILL PRACTICE THEIR SKILLS ON THE LAWN SURROUNDING THE COURTS, CREATING SAFETY ISSUES WITH THE ADJOINING GOLF COURSE. JUNIORS DON'T HAVE ACCESS TO SUITABLE FACILITIES OUTSIDE OF STRUCTURED LESSONS TO PRACTICE THEIR SKILLS.

THERE ARE NO TENNIS PRACTICE FACILITIES ACCESSIBLE TO THE DENMARK COMMUNITY. UNLESS PARTICIPANTS ARE MEMBERS OF A CLUB OR PAY HIRE FEES TO ACCESS A COURT, THERE IS NO ABILITY FOR THEM TO PRACTICE THEIR SKILLS. A PRACTICE WALL WHICH IS FREE AND OPEN TO THE COMMUNITY DURING DAY LIGHT HOURS WILL PROVIDE A FLEXIBLE SOLUTION TO A GROWING COMMUNITY NEED.

How will your project increase physical activity?

THE CONSTRUCTION OF A PRACTICE WALL WILL PROVIDE ALL PLAYERS WITH A SPACE TO PRACTICE AND IMPROVE THEIR SKILLS. THIS IS AN IMPORTANT STRATEGY TO KEEP JUNIOR PLAYERS DEVELOPING AND ENGAGED WITH THE SPORT.

THE CLUB AIMS TO USE THE WALL TO HELP DEVELOP JUNIOR PLAYER SKILLS AND TO GIVE THEM SPACE TO PRACTICE WHEN THE COURTS ARE FULL. THE WALL WILL ALSO ENABLE PLAYERS A SPACE TO WARM UP PRIOR TO COMPETING IN TOURNAMENTS, HELPING REDUCE THE RISK OF INJURY.

THE WALL WILL BE SITUATED OUTSIDE THE FENCED COURT SPACE, PROVIDING FREE, OPEN ACCESS FOR THE COMMUNITY AT ALL TIMES. THIS WILL ENCOURAGE PEOPLE INTO THE COUNTRY CLUB SPACE AND HELP TO DRAW NEW MEMBERS TO THE CLUB. 
