4. REPORTS

4.1. DEPARTMENT OF FIRE AND EMERGENCY SERVICES (DFES)

- Cam continues to fill the District Officer (DO) Albany Urban role until the position is filled through the standard recruitment process.
- High season appliances are now "State Operation Support Fleet" (SOSF)
 appliances. Ownership is with DFES, and they will be deployed as needed,
 regardless of season.
- DFES can organise a Rural Urban Interface exercise for Denmark. Lez to provide Cam with possible dates.
- Moir Drive can DFES assess current protections of the telecommunication infrastructure and revert with any recommendations for additional protection of the infrastructure? Mark has spoken to Telstra and associated stake holders; they are going to address the mitigation works required and adhere to the Fire and Fuel Management Notice moving forward.
- Chris Hoare thanked DFES for the excellent treatment of volunteers at the recent Esperance fire.

4.2. DEPARTMENT OF BIODIVERSITY, CONSERVATION AND ATTRACTIONS Report attached.

4.3. CHIEF BUSHFIRE CONTROL OFFICER

Report attached.

- The prohibited burning period has been extended to the end of March.
- The consolidation of three brigades into one new shed was discussed.

The CESM advised that DFES are not putting much money into sheds, so he is investigating a self-supporting loan. Mark stated that this would mean that the Shire would create a loan, and DFES would make the repayments.

Mark advised that he would be suggesting including earthworks in the next Council budget.

4.3.1. Fire weather officer

A deputy Fire Weather Officer (FWO) would be a good idea, Lez is willing to do this when he finishes the Chief Bush Fire Control Officer (CBFCO) role. There is no provision in the Act to have a deputy. Additional FWOs can be assigned.

4.3.2. Australian Fire Danger Rating Electronic Signage

RECOMMENDATION ITEM 4.3.2

That Council:

1. INCLUDE funding in the 2024/25 Draft Budget for the appointment of a grant writer to apply for grants to fund an upgrade of the existing signage to automated electronic signage; and

2. INCLUDE funding in the 2024/25 Draft Budget to cover any co-contribution requirements of grant.

4.4. COMMUNITY EMERGENCY SERVICES MANAGER

4.4.1. Firebreak and Fuel Management Notice.

Members to provide input via email to CESM for next firebreak and fuel management notice by the end of April 2024.

4.4.2. Tablets.

Non-profit Microsoft licenses are being arranged – each brigade will have their own unique email and licensing for Microsoft products.

Remote management software is installed on the tablets, and the Shire is working through some issues with this. Updates will be provided as the implementation progresses.

A unique BART logon has been established for each appliance. The new tablets will utilise these logons according to the appliance in which they are installed.

AlpineQuest licensing will be provided once brigade Microsoft licences are finalised.

4.4.3. Training requirements.

Brigades to provide a list of desired training courses to the CESM and he will endeavour to get the training delivered.

4.4.4. Personal Protective Clothing (PPC) – active members

Brigades to provide names & sizing for active members who require a second set of fire retardant (FR) trousers to the CESM, as soon as possible.

4.5. BUSHFIRE READY UPDATE

- Planning for the Bush Fire Ready (BFR) weekend in November 2024 has commenced.
- BFR groups have asked for all campfires to be banned, not just campers. Suggestion to make the language clearer in the notice.

4.6. AUSTRALIAN BLUEGUM PLANTATIONS

Paul Ashton provided a summary of Australian Bluegum Plantation's activities.

4.7 COUNCIL

Cr Campbell suggested that an item action register be developed so that all items that are unresolved remain active on the register until decided by the BFAC.

5.1. Town brigade windup.

RECOMMENDATION ITEM 5.1

That Council DEREGISTER the Town Volunteer Bush Fire Brigade for the following reasons:

- 1. The brigade has no bushfire appliance and therefore no capacity to operate in a bushfire brigade capacity. This has been the case for many years; and
- 2. The operational capacity of existing bushfire brigades has been deemed sufficient for the Shire of Denmark local government area and therefore the likelihood of obtaining a bushfire appliance for Town Brigade is extremely low.

 - a) a review of all Bush Fire Brigade Standard Operating Procedures; and
 - b) the development of any new required procedures relating to the *Work Health* and Safety Act 2020 (WA).

5.6. Conducting hazard reduction burns on private property - Craig Hughes

Currently, conducting hazard reduction burns on private property is problematic given the restrictions in place. Restrictions on no standing bush make it difficult to conduct brigade led burns.

Is there a way to provide more opportunity to conduct these burns?

Committee Response:

The burning of standing bush during restricted period on private property by brigades. This can be done with the approval of the Fire Weather Officer (FWO). Brigades are to

consult the FWO if the planned burn falls outside the standard permitted conditions. The FWO will consider the forecast conditions and the nature of the burn to determine whether to authorise the burn to proceed.

5.7 Standby generator for the airport - Geoff Bowley

RECOMMENDATION ITEM 5.7

That the Shire of Denmark, as owner/operator of the Denmark Airport, liaises with all stakeholders with the objective of installing a standby generator at the airport.

BFAC Denmark CBFCO Report 14th March 2024

Extension of Prohibited Period.

The City of Albany has also extended their Prohibited Period on our adjoining properties and land to the end of March.

Incidents.

- 1) 23/1/24 Report of smoke Hazelvale Rd North.
 - Fire was caused by a slasher in a paddock. Thanks to Walpole DBCA who assisted with locating the Fire and also with their attendance.
 - Fire was classed as accidental.
- 08/2/24 Report of heavy smoke in bush Sth Cst Hwy/Springdale Heights.
 Fire was classed as Justifiable false alarm, smoke thought to have from Broke Inlet.
- 9/2/24 Total Fire Ban plus HVMB report of a mini digger in use.
 69 Panorama Rd . Contractor ceased work immediately on my arrival and was educated.
- 4) 10/2/24 Suttons Rd/Porch rd report of a plume of smoke. Fire was classed as justifiable false alarm, it was a re-ignition inside a burnt area of a completed DBCA burn.
- 5) 13/2/24 Scotsdale Rd/Howe Rd Report of smoke near a shed.
 - Brigades turned out to find that the owner had self extinguished after a fire was caused whilst welding/grinding.
 - Fire was classed as Accidental.
- 6) 23/2/24 23 Beaufortia Gardens report of smoke.
 - Illegal Fire, owner was burning garden waste. AFDR was High.
 - Report was sent into Shire for processing.
 - This owner was under the illusion that he had an incinerator. I feel that the Fire Management notice needs to describe what an incinerator is. Ie, An enclosed purpose built Fire container with a spark arrester on the chimney.
- 7) 6/3/24 56 Pittam Way Report of smoke.
 - Illegal camp fire.
 - Report will be sent into Shire for processing.

Donated funds.

We have considered all Brigades wish lists and what operational equipment we believed the Brigades could use.

There is a sample of a Lay Flat Hose rewinder and 6 of these units have been ordered for the following Brigades: East Denmark, Shaddy, Ocean Beach, William Bay, Peaceful Bay and Nornalup.

The costs of these 6 items is around \$8250 leaving a balance of around \$5750 remaining for further equipment purchases.

ComCen pre determined call outs:

Myself and Deputies have had a meeting with Cam (DFES) and Darin (Denmark VFRS) regarding an agreement for combined turnouts for BFB and FRS within certain catchment areas.

The purpose is to minimise an incident blow out caused by a delayed response. If Appliances are stood down then that would be a great result.

Example:

Fire in Peaceful Bay.

ComCen would automatically turn out Peaceful Bay, Nornalup, Tingledale and VFRS for asset protection/

Example:

Fire within Gazetted area (VFRS Incident)

ComCen would automatically turn out VFRS, East Denmark, Ocean Beach possibly Shaddy

Central Zone new shed build.

The suggestion is to build 1 new shed with a 3 bay parking are for Carmarthen, William Bay and Parryville appliances to be housed in.

This is deemed to be more attractive to DFES as only 1 shed will be replaced. Brigade FCOs are in agreement with this proposal.

Mark can explain self funded loans etc.

Thoughts on putting a motion to Council at the next meeting to put shed earthworks into the 24/25 Budget.

DBCA Frankland have responded to 4 fires within the district since last report. 1 fire was located within the Shire of Denmark.

Walpole airstrip is currently only available for water bomber reloading between 0900-1500, due to high kangaroo numbers. DBCA has commenced early stage planning to fence the airstrip.

Fire Resource Availability

Water bombing and reconnaissance aircraft are all currently operational. The Mt Frankland fire tower has been extended into March due to the continuation of the Prohibited Season in both the Shire of Denmark and the Shire of Manjimup.

Second bulldozer currently available in the district.

Communication Infrastructure

New phone tower is planned to be installed in June 2024 at William Bay to provide mobile reception for carpark. A second new tower is also planned to be installed in June 2024 at Mazzoletti Beach to provide service in the carpark.
