- Any product that is manufactured, transported, used for minutes & discarded must be reconsidered

- Reduction of harmful chemicals & microplastics in the environment & our bodies
- Increased revenue when customers dine-in
- Save money, storage space & waste disposal costs
- Reusable cups are COVID safe



#### How?

- Set up a Mug Library .....we can provide you with a cup exchange starter kit - a basket of upcycled mugs & information posters for customers
- Set-up a station for the mug library box where your community can return used mugs.
- Loan cups on trust or return and share mugs with participating cafe outlets (easy in a small regional town like Denmark!
- Add a surcharge for single-use cups (like the supermarkets do for bags).

# Tips on how to Engage your Customers

- Start having conversations with your customers about the State led changes and why it is important to you as a cafe owner
- Remember the facts of 1000
   adults interviewed in WA, 91% were
   not comfortable purchasing a
   disposable cup & support action to
   reduce plastic waste
- You can offer 'keep cups' to purchase; it is encouraged that good quality options are chosen to minimalise these also becoming a waste issue

Put up information posters and formulate a cheat sheet for cup size & shots required.











A mug library is a great way to encourage your community to embrace reusables. A collection of mugs, cups or jars for people to borrow and return (like a library), instead of using single-use. It's especially handy for those regulars who forget their own reusables (you know the ones) or for people who come in for an unexpected takeaway.
