Key features:

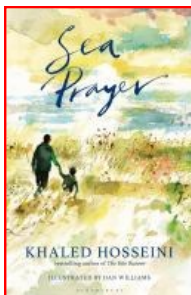
- Search for items, and reserve the ones that interest you

Download the Spydus Mobile app from the App/Play Store and login using your library card number and password (default password is '6333').

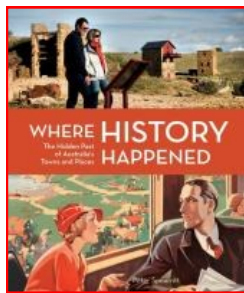
