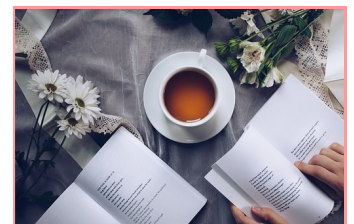
### Shakespeare Reading Group
