What resources are available following a bushfire?

Where can I get welfare and financial assistance?

Waste queries?

Skip bins for general waste only are still located at Parryville Hall and at the intersection of Mt Shadforth Rd and McLeod Rd. Please do not use the skip bins for scrap metal disposal. The Denmark Tip accepts scrap metal free of charge. Bushfire impacted residents are encouraged to take all waste not suitable for general waste disposal directly to the tip and use tip passes. If you require additional tip passes, please call the Shire to arrange.

Where can I get help with fencing?

BlazeAid will coordinate a volunteering effort to provide the human-power to reinstate damaged fencing. Right now, the Shire is managing a fencing register to capture the amount of fencing assistance required. When BlazeAid arrives, their coordinator will take over. In the meantime, farmers are encouraged to get materials ready to go so when the volunteers arrive they can get stuck in.

Where can I get help with livestock feed?
