Denmark Seed Library

Denmark's very own Seed Library sprung into action this spring. A partnership between the Library and the Denmark campus of South Regional TAFE has made a collection of organic, heirloom and locally grown seeds available to the community. The Seed Library is based at the Library and has been started with seed that is collected each year at the certified organic garden at TAFE as part of its horticulture programmes. These vegetable and herb seeds can now find their way into people's gardens, with library members encouraged to 'borrow' seeds, grow the plants, enjoy the harvest, let some go to seed and then return some clean dry seed back to the library for future circulation.

Following the launch of the Seed Library in November, over 50 people have borrowed more than 120 packets of seed. An initial 'Something Seedy' workshop at the library during Seniors Week was enthusiastically attended, with more seed saving events planned for the future. People are encouraged to come in to the library to find out more, check out the selection of seeds available and be inspired to have a go at growing something at home.
