| 1 | Water <br> Corporation | The Water Corporation has no concerns with the proposed land exchange. <br> There is a 150mm diameter PVC gravity sewer running along (inside) the <br> western boundary of Lot 1088. This sewer is part of the local sewer network <br> that services houses in the area. At this stage there is no need to establish an <br> easement over the sewer as it is already afforded protection under the powers <br> of the Water Services Act and Regulations. The sewer cannot be built over and <br> any future subdivision of this portion of Lot 1088 will need to accommodate the <br> sewer in place. <br> Under the land exchange circumstances described in your email, it is unlikely <br> that an application to amalgamate these portions into one lot would attract any <br> servicing conditions. However, this is a matter for the WAPC to determine at <br> the application stage and the proponent should be advised to address this issue <br> in their supporting information submitted with the application. | Noted. |  |
| 2 | Western <br> Power | Having done a desk top review of your submission, Western Power does not <br> have any objection at this time to the proposed land exchange between <br> Reserve 45473 and Lot 9033 Honeymyrtle Circuit and there are no identifiable <br> assets that would be encroached by the proposed. <br> If further information is required, a project will need to be submitted via a <br> website to perform a detailed assessment. | Noted. |  |
