

		DWER understands that the site was historically used as an agricultural research station and that historical advice from the Environmental Protection Authority (Predecessor agency to DWER) indicated that a preliminary site investigation (PSI) would need to be conducted in order to assess the site for potential contamination in soil and groundwater arising from the use of chemicals such as pesticides, fertilizers and herbicides, that may have been used and stored at the site in the past.	
		DWER advises that Lot 7468 is not classified under the <i>Contaminated Sites Act 2003</i> , and DWER holds no information relating to the contamination status of this lot.	
		Based on the available information, DWER has no objection to the proposed Scheme Amendment No. 139. However, if Lot 7468 is proposed for development in future, an investigation for potential contamination at the site may be required and DWER may recommend a contamination condition be applied to the development approval.
