

Proposed New Machinery Shed for Denmark Machinery Restoration Group


The Denmark Machinery Restoration Group is —as the name proclaims— a group of enthusiasts dedicated to the acquisition, restoration and preservation of historic machinery. Our goal, our 'end product' if you will, is the collection of restored machines in our **Trackside Museum.**

This museum is freely available to all to visit. It is our pride and joy and our contribution to the Denmark Community. Denmark has a long history of development from forestry to agriculture which in turn depended on machinery, most of which has been allowed to rust away.

This museum is very much a work in progress, with the usual growing pains. We rely mostly upon donations of machinery from local farmers and businesses. And a lot of theses pieces are big. And all need to be housed out of the weather that has been, up to now, slowly destroying them. Outside we now have a Galion Grader and a rare Fowler Crane. Both are too tall to fit into our existing building, even if we did have floor space! And there are more in the pipeline that we cannot even consider taking now.

To rectify this problem we propose to build a standard kit-form shed, 24 metre wide, 9 metre deep with 4 metre clearance to house these machines. The shed will give us storage for new acquisitions, and also be somewhere to put the overflow from our main shed, Our Museum Hall is sadly over stuffed with an untidy clutter of equipment and is in desperate need of organisation.


The other advantage of the new shed is that it will face towards and will be clearly visible from Inlet Drive. Out plan is to spell out 'MUSEUM' in huge letters across the front of the shed. One disadvantage of our current location is that most people don't know it's there. This will do a lot to rectify that lack.



This application is for the construction of the shed only. The necessary access to enable movement of machinery will need to be considered along with the proposed new crossing and roadwork for the Spirit of Play School and the new Mens' Shed.

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

Thank you for the invitation to comment on this development application as a long-term stakeholder and leaseholder of the Denmark Railway Station No.3 Reserve.

Spirit of Play has operated continuously from the *Denmark Railway Station No.3 Reserve* since 2003. This followed on from eleven years of education provision between 1991 and 2002 by the Department of Education from the Old Post Office Building.

In 2009, Spirit of Play provided a letter of support to the Denmark Machinery Restoration Group when the group was attempting to acquire a lease at the *Denmark Railway Station No.3 Reserve* and establish the Trackside Museum.
