As part of these reforms, the Shire of Denmark is taking steps to produce a 'simplified, short-form council plan [to] replace strategic community plans and set high-level objectives'.

Our Future 2035 is our new Council Plan, combining the spirit and ethos of our key documents (replacing our Strategic Community Plan Our Future 2033 and Corporate Business Plan 2024–2028) with up-to-date community consultation results and feedback.

Instead of remaining a stand-alone strategy, our Sustainability Strategy 2021–2031 has also been embedded into Our Future 2035, reflecting our commitment to ensuring everything we do on a day-to-day basis has a sustainability focus.

What is a Council Plan?

Our *Council Plan: Our Future 2035* is a live document. The actions and projects you find in the pages of this plan the Shire of Denmark is currently, and will soon be, working on bringing to life for the benefit of our community.

This *Council Plan* begins with our community's **high level** aspirations and goals, and develops into more **detail** of how we plan to deliver.

What is the 'High Level'?

This is our community-led vision and priorities, identified through continued community consultation. This part of the plan incorporates our *Strategic Community Plan* **Vision** and **Commitment** and our *Sustainability Strategy* **Goals** to set the guidelines and direction for all Shire of Denmark operations and planning.

What is the 'Detail'?

This is the *Corporate Business Plan* part of the document. Included are the projects and actions we're preparing and planning to deliver on, bringing that **vision** to life inline with our **sustainability goals**. Summaries of community feedback trends highlight immediate and long-term community priorities, as well as areas of service delivery which have room for improvement.

How to Read the Council Plan

It's important to keep a few things in mind as you read...

Community Feedback

Community feedback is the backbone of this *Council Plan*. We never pick projects or priorities out of thin air and we've taken care to summarise community feedback and priorities throughout so you can clearly see how we've identified the path ahead for the coming years. In this Plan, we strike a balance between long-term planning and responsive action on priorities that matter to our community.

Our Action Plan

This is our working plan, not a document on a shelf. It guides our team and keeps us transparent and accountable to our community.

Funding

The 5-Year Action Plan (see page 13 onwards) outlines our priorities and activities. To ensure these are achievable we align them with our financial planning documents and regulatory requirements.

Year 1 (2025/26) is resourced through the annual budget, which includes detailed costings for services, operations, projects and capital expenditure.

Years 2 to 5 reflect our *Long Term Financial Plan* — a 10-year forecast of income and expenditure. We have utilised existing projections to estimate project costs for future years. These estimates will be reviewed and refined.

In building this *Council Plan*, all activities have been identified with the associated expenditure in the *Long Term Financial Plan*. The expenditure areas are:

- Operating Activities
- Capital Expenditure
- Projects and Initiatives

Review

This Council Plan is the result of a minor review of our Strategic Community Plan, which underwent a major review in 2022. This Plan will be due for major review in 2027.

The Role of Local Government

For many smaller Local Governments across Western Australia, like the Shire of Denmark, the role of the Local Government within the fabric of the local community is a central one.

We **ADVOCATE** for our community and promote local interests to help them flourish.

We **REGULATE** compliance through legislation, regulations and local laws to ensure that community members live safely and respectfully in our community.

You Told Us We're Improving...

2025 Scorecard results show our community thinks our service delivery across the range of our work has improved from 2022. Most Improved: Youth services and facilities, Local roads, Stormwater drainage.

But There's More Work To Do...

Your feedback highlighted the continued need for improved consultation, transparency, and advocacy, prompting a renewed focus on trust and integrity.

Responsible development, infrastructure, and preserving our small-town character are important to our community as Denmark grows, and there's strong support for sustainable housing options and the protection of green spaces. Environmental conservation is the top concern, with residents urging action—such as implementing sustainable development standards, protecting trees, and promoting responsible tourism —to safeguard Denmark's natural beauty.

Library services received praise but are under-appreciated, offering room for revitalisation of this service. Sports and recreation need attention, with demands on playing fields rising. Senior services are an area for improvement with our community seeking expanded access to health, recreation, and social programs. There is strong support for reviving cultural events and calls for deeper collaboration with the Noongar community, as well as more local eco-friendly and participatory programs.

Community feedback highlighted strong interest in the development of a public swimming pool. Council has thoroughly assessed the feasibility and potential risks of undertaking such a major project and resolved that further investigation should begin in 10 years, to prepare for the local population reaching 10,000 residents. This population threshold will likely be met by 2045.

- Continue to deliver key infrastructure projects including Ocean Beach, Berridge Park and the Shire Depot
- Move to reduce carbon emissions, including from the burning of green waste
- Assess and plan the sporting facilities needed for the next 10 years
- Revitalise the Denmark Public Library
- Deliver on recommendations from recently completed plans including Turner Rd Mountain Bike Plan, Bushland Reserves Weeds Strategy, Coastal Reserves Management Plan, and the Kooryunderup-Mt Hallowell Management Plan once it is
- Continue our strong commitment to improving the road network

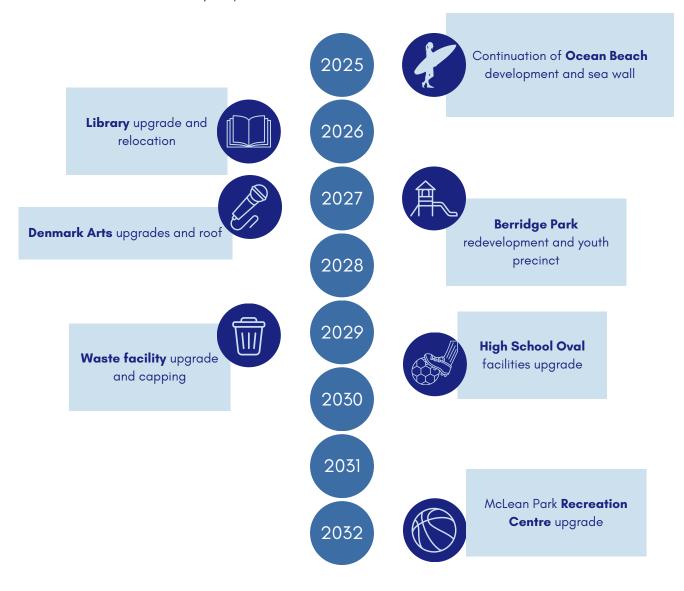

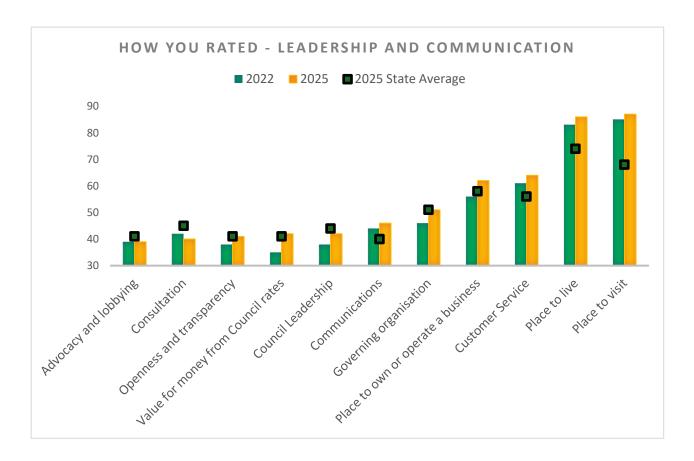

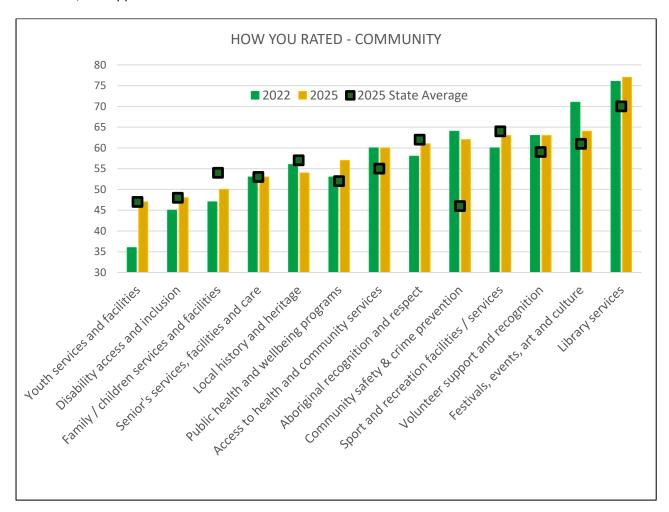

Our Community Services: Strong Performance, Strategic Opportunities

The library remains our top-performing service, consistently exceeding industry benchmarks and outperforming peers. Despite this, it is undervalued in community priorities, presenting an opportunity to better communicate its impact. There is growing support for a refreshed, expanded facility offering broader services.

Sports and recreation facilities and senior services have emerged as key areas for improvement, with clear potential to better meet local needs. Youth services have shown the most notable improvement since 2022, reflecting successful engagement with younger residents.

The community deeply values Denmark's arts and cultural heritage, calling for renewed investment in festivals, markets, and creative events. There is a level of concern over the decline of iconic events like Brave New Works, the Festival of Voice, and the Christmas Pageant, with strong support for their revival. Residents also seek deeper collaboration with the Noongar community, more participatory and eco-focused events, and the return of traditions like the riverside markets. Arts and culture are vital to Denmark's identity, cohesion, and appeal.

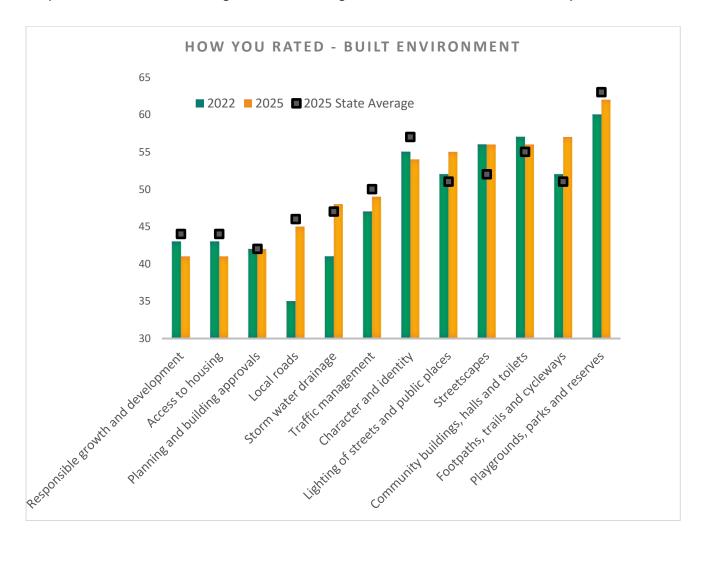

This means resisting large-scale subdivisions and supporting medium-density housing, tiny homes, and other innovative, sustainable living options that reflect our values and lifestyle.

Sustainability must be at the heart of all new community developments. This includes protecting trees and green spaces and ensuring that every project contributes positively to our environment and community well-being. Encouragingly, we've seen real progress in key areas since the last survey—local roads, stormwater drainage, footpaths, trails, cycleways, playgrounds, parks, reserves, and lighting have all improved. 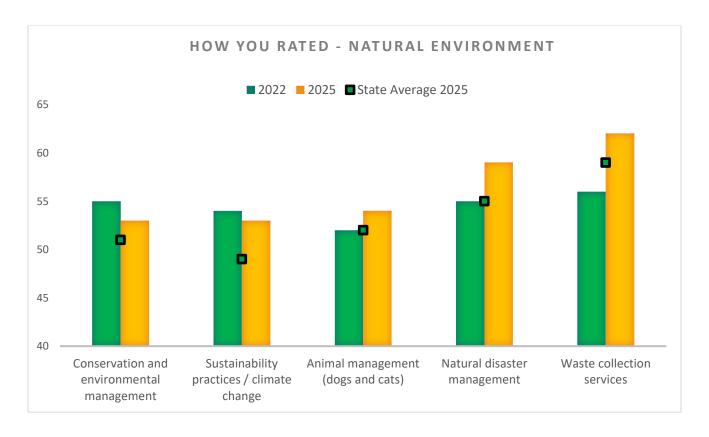
Protecting What We Treasure: A Call for Stronger Conservation

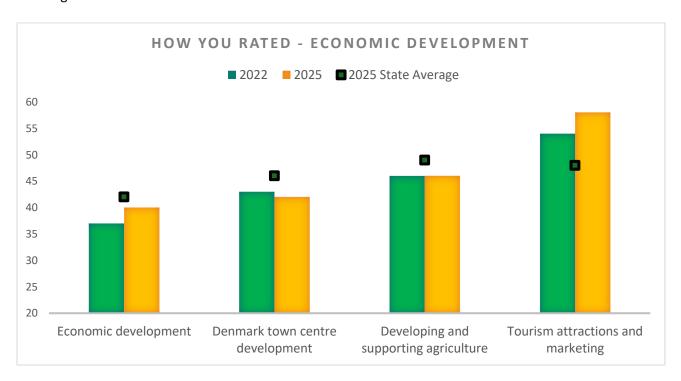

At the same time, affordable housing remains a pressing issue, particularly for younger residents aged 18–34. These challenges underscore the need for balanced, community-centred planning, where tourism is managed sustainably, infrastructure keeps pace with demand, and housing remains accessible to all.
