


Kanopy User Guide



Kanopy provides access to one of the most unique collections of films in the world including award-winning documentaries, indie and foreign films, must see classics and blockbuster movies.



Using Kanopy on a tablet or smartphone device

- Download the **Kanopy app** from the App Store (Apple) or Google Play Store (Android).
- **Open** up the Kanopy App.
- **Tap Get Started**
- **Find and Select your Library.**
- Enter your **library card number and password**
- **Enter your personal details and choose a password.**
- A verification message will be sent to your email address. Open the email sent to you by Kanopy and click on the link to **verify your email**.

Using Kanopy from a computer or laptop

- Open your Internet Browser and navigate to the Kanopy website www.kanopy.com/group/wa. Alternatively you can access the site from the library websites eResources link.
- **Search for your library** or select one from the menu.
- Click **Add Library Card** if it is your first time using Kanopy.
- Enter your **library card number and password** (your password will be given to you on registering the library— please ask staff for assistance)
- Enter your **personal details and choose a password to create an account.**
- A verification message will be sent to your email address. Open the email sent to you by Kanopy and click on the link to **verify your email**.
- **Login** to Kanopy using the email address and password you entered in step 4.

You can use Kanopy to stream up to **4 videos per calendar month**
