5.2.1 Command Vehicle

- 1. That Council note that the Volunteer Bush Fire Brigades of Denmark are not seeking or expecting that Council contribute to the capital cost of the vehicle.
- 2. That Council permit the Volunteer Brigades to continue to seek funding from other sources to allow the purchase of the vehicle.

- 3. That Council support the Volunteer Bush Fire Brigades by allowing the use of the Shire as an entity for an application to Lotterywest and or other grant bodies.
- 4. That in order that there is no additional financial impact on the Shire for the recurrent costs of the vehicle, that Council consider a revised budget for the funds that the Shire already makes available for other fire expenses.

5.2.3 Restricted Burning Time – Key Triggers to Move Date Forward

Restricted and Prohibited Burning Times

At the December 2015 BFAC meeting a sub-committee was formed to consider and make recommendations to BFAC about the appropriateness of the current dates set for the start and finish of the Restricted Burning Periods (RBP) and the key triggers that might be available to assist with any decision to alter these dates.

The sub-committee met on Tuesday 16 February and was assisted by CESM Marcus Owen and DPaW Wes Bailye.

The sub-committee considered the key triggers that should be used to assist in any determination to alter the dates of the RBP and determined that the following factors were helpful in any assessment:

- Southern Australia Seasonal Bushfire Outlook, released by the Bushfire and Natural Hazards Cooperative Research Centre in September each year
- Soil Dryness Index (Ground Moisture) maintained by the Bureau of Meteorology
- Advice from DPaW and DFES
- Local observations and experience

The sub-committee suggests that the sub-committee be used as a resource to assist the Shire and Chief to consider any alterations of dates from time to time.

The sub-committee also considered the appropriateness of the existing times that are currently applied to the RBP. The sub-committee recommend that the following dates be adopted commencing with the 2016/2017 bush fire season:

- Restricted Burning Period be altered to:
 - i. 1 November to 15 December
 - ii. 1 March to 30 April
- Prohibited Burning Period be altered to: 16 December to Last day of February

The sub-committee has recommended these changes because of the following factors:

- The existing dates have been in place for quite some time and have not been reviewed recently in light of reduced annual rainfall.
- The dates are easier to remember with most being aligned with the start and finish of the relevant month.
- Residents and occupiers can still burn with a permit during the Restricted Period but the permit process will reinforce the requirement to have appropriate resources on hand and allows the BFS to manage the number and nature of burns.
- Bringing forward the commencement of the Prohibited Burning Period provides a more appropriate buffer prior to the Christmas holiday period.

 - 1 November to 15 December
 - o 1 March to 30 April
- Prohibited Burning Period:
 - 16 December to Last day of February

The CESM has spoken with the Project Manager Mr Chris Hoare and was informed that there is no funding shortfall and that the project is now fully funded.

The committee now need to make a decision on where the donation from the Water Corp, \$600, it be dispersed to participating brigades or towards funding the Command/Support vehicle.

The aim is to produce a document that contains the relevant information that everyone requires with links to the Shire website to the more concise & specific information.

On completion of the draft document it will need to be presented to Council for adoption/endorsement.

The aim is to have this finalised and in place for the 2017/18 Fire Season.

8.2 Firefighting Equipment on Private Property

In recent times it has become evident that property owners have been noncompliant, with point 7 on a permit to burn, by having insufficient or even no water on hand when carrying out burns;

Sufficient water and equipment must be on hand to completely extinguish and / or prevent the spread of the fire.

As written on the reverse of the permit, the permit holder must comply with the conditions set on the permit.

Points for consideration (but not limited to);

1. In the Fire Regulation Notice it is to be stipulated what 'Sufficient water' is; determined by per property size and/or zoning.

e.g. Residential 0.25ha or less – garden hoses - provided they can cover the whole of the block or

Rural Land – a mobile firefighting unit (tray or trailer mounted) comprising of a tank with a minimum capacity of 400L, fitted with 20m of 19mm firefighting hose and a pump capable of delivering water through and adjustable nozzle in the spray (fog) and jet configurations.

2. When the permit is written the FCO stipulates on the permit what 'Sufficient' water is.

8.3 William Bay Truck

Lights and sirens not working – CESM to follow up with Nurrunga Comms.

8.4 East Denmark Appliances

On both appliances you need to turn the emergency lights off to be able to use the radio due to excessive static.

CESM to follow up with DFES while the 2.4 is currently undergoing its crew protection fit out in Perth.

8.5 Volunteer Insurance Cover

Adrian Kranendonk informed the committee of his disappointment at slowness of the progression of his insurance claim and how much he was out of pocket and to date the lack of reimbursement.

Adrian did state that his complaint was directed at LGIS and not the Shire of Denmark.
